- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 25.025(a), Tax Code, is amended to read
- 6 as follows:
- 7 (a) This section applies only to:
- 8 (1) a current or former peace officer as defined by
- 9 Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure;
- 10 (2) a county jailer as defined by Section 1701.001,
- 11 Occupations Code;
- 12 (3) an employee of the Texas Department of Criminal
- 13 Justice;
- 14 (4) a commissioned security officer as defined by
- 15 Section 1702.002, Occupations Code;
- 16 (5) a victim of family violence as defined by Section
- 17 71.004, Family Code, if as a result of the act of family violence
- 18 against the victim, the actor is convicted of a felony or a Class A
- 19 misdemeanor;
- 20 (6) a federal judge, a state judge, or the spouse of a
- 21 federal judge or state judge;
- 22 (7) a current or former employee of a district
- 23 attorney, criminal district attorney, or county or municipal
- 24 attorney whose jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child

- 1 protective services matters;
- 2 (8) an officer or employee of a community supervision
- 3 and corrections department established under Chapter 76,
- 4 Government Code, who performs a duty described by Section 76.004(b)
- 5 of that code;
- 6 (9) a criminal investigator of the United States as
- 7 described by Article 2.122(a), Code of Criminal Procedure; [and]
- 8 (10) a police officer or inspector of the United
- 9 States Federal Protective Service; and
- 10 (11) a current or former United States attorney or
- 11 assistant United States attorney and the spouse and child of the
- 12 <u>attorney</u>.
- 13 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
