H.B. No. 3307

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the confidentiality of certain home address information
in ad valorem tax appraisal records.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 25.025(a), Tax Code, is amended to read
as follows:

(a) This section applies only to:

(1) a current or former peace officer as defined by
Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure;

(2) a county jailer as defined by Section 1701.001,
Occupations Code;

(3) an employee of the Texas Department of Criminal
Justice;

(4) a commissioned security officer as defined by
Section 1702.002, Occupations Code;

(5) a victim of family violence as defined by Section
71.004, Family Code, if as a result of the act of family violence
against the victim, the actor is convicted of a felony or a Class A
misdemeanor;

(6) a federal judge, a state judge, or the spouse of a
federal judge or state judge;

(7) a current or former employee of a district
attorney, criminal district attorney, or county or municipal
attorney whose jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child

2 (8) an officer or employee of a community supervision
3 and corrections department established under Chapter 76,
4 Government Code, who performs a duty described by Section 76.004(b)
5 of that code;

6 (9) a criminal investigator of the United States as
7 described by Article 2.122(a), Code of Criminal Procedure; ~~and~~

8 (10) a police officer or inspector of the United
9 States Federal Protective Service; and

10 (11) a current or former United States attorney or
11 assistant United States attorney and the spouse and child of the
12 attorney.

13 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
17 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
