1-6 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED  
1-7 AN ACT

1-8 relating to the confidentiality of certain home address information  
1-9 in ad valorem tax appraisal records.

1-10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-11 SECTION 1. Section 25.025(a), Tax Code, is amended to read  
1-12 as follows:

1-13 (a) This section applies only to:

1-14 (1) a current or former peace officer as defined by  
1-15 Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure;

1-16 (2) a county jailer as defined by Section 1701.001,  
1-17 Occupations Code;

1-18 (3) an employee of the Texas Department of Criminal  
1-19 Justice;

1-20 (4) a commissioned security officer as defined by  
1-21 Section 1702.002, Occupations Code;

1-22 (5) a victim of family violence as defined by Section  
1-23 71.004, Family Code, if as a result of the act of family violence  
1-24 against the victim, the actor is convicted of a felony or a Class A  
1-25 misdemeanor;

1-26 (6) a federal judge, a state judge, or the spouse of a  
1-27 federal judge or state judge;

1-28 (7) a current or former employee of a district  
1-29 attorney, criminal district attorney, or county or municipal  
1-30 attorney whose jurisdiction includes any criminal law or child  
1-31 protective services matters;

1-32 (8) an officer or employee of a community supervision  
1-33 and corrections department established under Chapter 76,  
1-34 Government Code, who performs a duty described by Section 76.004(b)  
1-35 of that code;

1-36 (9) a criminal investigator of the United States as  
1-37 described by Article 2.122(a), Code of Criminal Procedure; ~~and~~

1-38 (10) a police officer or inspector of the United  
1-39 States Federal Protective Service; and

1-40 (11) a current or former United States attorney or  
1-41 assistant United States attorney and the spouse and child of the  
1-42 attorney.

1-43 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives  
1-44 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as  
1-45 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this  
1-46 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this  
1-47 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.

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
