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2-1 (H) selecting appropriate child care; and (I) other resources available in the state; 2-3 (3) document in the woman's record that the woman 2-4 received the resource pamphlet described in Subdivision (1) and the 2-5 resource guide described in Subdivision (2), if applicable; and 2-6 (4) retain the documentation for at least five years 2-7 in the hospital's, birthing center's, physician's, nurse midwife's, 2-8 or midwife's records.

2-9 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 2-10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 2-11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 2-12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 2-13 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.

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
