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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the state's historically underutilized business program, including the establishment of a contractor point system. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter D, Chapter 2161, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 2161.184 to read as follows: 6 7 Sec. 2161.184. POINT SYSTEM. (a) A state agency shall require a contractor to undertake the good faith efforts described 8 by this section, to the extent required by the comptroller, on 9 projects subject to this subchapter. 10 (b) The comptroller shall adopt rules establishing points 11 12 to be awarded for taking each good faith effort and the minimum number of points required, depending on project size, cost, type, 13 14 and other factors considered relevant by the comptroller. In establishing the point system, the comptroller may not require a 15 contractor to earn more than 50 points, and the comptroller must 16 assign each of the efforts listed in Subsections (c)(1) through 17 (10) at least 10 points. A state agency may require that additional 18 19 good faith efforts be taken, as indicated in its bid specifications. 20 21 (c) For purposes of the system established under this section, good faith efforts include: 22 (1) contacting historically underutilized businesses 23 24 that reasonably could have been expected to submit a quote and that

2 (8) providing assistance to an otherwise qualified
3 historically underutilized business in securing needed equipment,
4 loan capital, lines of credit, or joint pay agreements, including
5 waiving credit that is ordinarily required, and assisting
6 historically underutilized businesses in obtaining the same unit
7 pricing with the bidder's suppliers in order to help historically
8 underutilized businesses in establishing credit;

9 <u>(9) negotiating joint venture and partnership</u> 10 <u>arrangements with historically underutilized businesses in order</u> 11 <u>to increase opportunities for historically underutilized business</u> 12 <u>participation on a state construction or repair project when</u> 13 <u>possible; and</u>

14 (10) providing quick pay agreements and policies to 15 enable historically underutilized business contractors and 16 suppliers to meet cash flow demands.

17 SECTION 2. Section 2161.253, Government Code, is amended by 18 adding Subsections (f) and (g) to read as follows:

19 (f) If evidence of a good faith effort to implement a historically underutilized business subcontracting plan required 20 under Section 2161.252 includes notice to minority or women trade 21 organizations or development centers to assist in identifying 22 23 historically underutilized businesses, the notice must be provided 24 at least 10 working days before the due date for submission of the response, including a bid, proposal, offer, or other applicable 25 26 expression of interest. 27 (g) If evidence of a good faith effort to implement a

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historically underutilized business subcontracting plan required under Section 2161.252 includes notice to historically underutilized businesses that the contractor intends to subcontract under a contract, the contractor may not require historically underutilized businesses to respond to the notice before the 10th working day after the date the notice is provided. SECTION 3. Section 2161.253, Government Code, as amended by

8 this Act, applies only to a contract for which a state agency first 9 advertises or otherwise solicits bids, proposals, offers, or 10 qualifications, as applicable, on or after September 1, 2011.

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
