1-7 AN ACT

1-8 relating to establishing a child care advisory committee to advise
1-9 the Texas Facilities Commission.

1-10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

1-11 SECTION 1. Section 663.051, Government Code, is reenacted
1-12 and amended to read as follows:

1-13 Sec. 663.051. ADVISORY COMMITTEE. (a) The commission
1-14 shall appoint a child care advisory committee composed of
1-15 individuals who are interested in child care services for state
1-16 employees.

1-17 (b) The commission may appoint to the committee:

1-18 (1) the executive directors of:

1-19 (A) the commission; and

1-20 (B) the Texas Department of Housing and Community
1-21 Affairs;

1-22 (2) two representatives of nonprofit organizations
1-23 involved with the delivery or support of child care services;

1-24 (3) ~~[a representative of the corporate child~~
1-25 ~~development fund;~~

1-26 ~~[(4)]~~ a representative of child care providers;

1-27 (4) ~~[(5)]~~ one or more state employees subject to the
1-28 state classification plan:

1-29 (A) each of whom has at least one child in a child
1-30 care facility; and

1-31 (B) if more than one is appointed, each of whom
1-32 resides in a different geographic area of the state; and

1-33 (5) ~~[(6)]~~ one or more individuals knowledgeable in
1-34 child care services or the need of working individuals for child
1-35 care services.

1-36 (c) The committee shall advise the commission on the:

1-37 (1) location, size, and design of the child care
1-38 facilities; and

1-39 (2) curriculum a child care facility must provide to
1-40 ensure the provision of developmentally appropriate services of a
1-41 high quality.

1-42 (d) The committee is abolished and this section expires
1-43 September 1, 2021.

1-44 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.

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
