A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to improving nutrition and health outcomes among
- 3 recipients of benefits under the supplemental nutrition assistance
- 4 program.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. FINDINGS AND DECLARATION OF POLICY. The
- 7 legislature finds that:
- 8 (1) Texans are committed to ensuring the health of
- 9 families and children and understand the importance of the role
- 10 preventive health care measures have on population health and the
- 11 state economy;
- 12 (2) consuming healthy foods such as fruits,
- 13 vegetables, whole grains, fat-free and low-fat dairy products, and
- 14 seafood, and consuming fewer foods with sodium, saturated and trans
- 15 fats, added sugars, and refined grains, are important preventive
- 16 health care measures; and
- 17 (3) public benefits programs that provide recipients
- 18 with access to an adequate and nutritional diet should incorporate
- 19 sound nutritional principles and promote the health and well-being
- 20 of recipients.
- 21 SECTION 2. WAIVER OR OTHER AUTHORIZATION TO IMPROVE
- 22 NUTRITION AND HEALTH OUTCOMES UNDER CERTAIN PROGRAMS. (a) The
- 23 executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission
- 24 shall develop and seek a waiver or other appropriate authorization

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- 1 from the United States secretary of agriculture under Section 17,
- 2 Food and Nutrition Act of 2008 (7 U.S.C. Section 2026), to make
- 3 changes to the supplemental nutrition assistance program provided
- 4 under Chapter 33, Human Resources Code, to improve nutrition and
- 5 health outcomes among recipients of benefits under the program.
- 6 (b) In developing the waiver or other authorization under
- 7 Subsection (a) of this section, the executive commissioner of the
- 8 Health and Human Services Commission may consider the feasibility,
- 9 including the costs and benefits, of:
- 10 (1) restricting the purchase of certain food items
- 11 with minimal nutritional value under the supplemental nutrition
- 12 assistance program; and
- 13 (2) promoting healthy food choices by recipients of
- 14 benefits under the program.
- 15 (c) In developing the waiver or other authorization under
- 16 Subsection (a) of this section, the executive commissioner of the
- 17 Health and Human Services Commission shall solicit input from
- 18 interested persons, including state agencies that administer
- 19 nutritional assistance programs, nonprofit organizations that
- 20 administer hunger relief programs, health care providers,
- 21 nutrition experts, food retailers, and food industry
- 22 representatives.
- 23 (d) As soon as practicable after the effective date of this
- 24 Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human Services
- 25 Commission shall apply for and actively pursue the waiver or other
- 26 authorization as required by Subsection (a) of this section.
- 27 SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect

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- 1 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 2 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 3 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for
- 4 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
