- 1 certificate that is filed with the Texas Department of Licensing
- 2 and Regulation on or after the effective date of this Act. An
- 3 application for the issuance or renewal of a license or certificate
- 4 that is filed before the effective date of this Act is governed by
- 5 the law in effect on the date the application was filed, and the
- 6 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 7 SECTION 23. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
