3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Title 4, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is
5	amended by adding Chapter 87A to read as follows:
6	CHAPTER 87A. LIABILITY FOR DEATH OF PET
7	Sec. 87A.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
8	(1) "Governmental unit" has the meaning assigned by
9	Section 42.001.
10	(2) "Pet" means a domesticated animal, including a cat
11	or dog, that is owned by an individual and kept in or near the
12	household of the individual for the primary purpose of
13	companionship.
14	Sec. 87A.002. LIABILITY. (a) A person is liable as
15	provided by Subsection (b) if the person engages in conduct that:
16	(1) intentionally causes the death of a pet; or
17	(2) negligently causes the death of a pet and the
18	<pre>conduct takes place:</pre>
19	(A) on the property of the pet's owner or
20	<pre>caretaker; or</pre>
21	(B) while the pet is under the control or
22	supervision of the pet's owner or caretaker.
23	(b) A person who is liable under Subsection (a) is liable to
24	the pet's owner for damages and any other appropriate relief for the

- 1 loss of companionship or society of the pet.
- 2 Sec. 87A.003. LIMITATION ON DAMAGES. (a) In an action for
- 3 the death of a pet under this chapter, damages, including
- 4 noneconomic and exemplary damages, may not exceed \$5,000 for each
- 5 pet.
- 6 (b) Noneconomic damages awarded under this chapter are
- 7 solely for the loss of reasonably expected companionship or society
- 8 of the pet. This section may not be construed to limit the amount of
- 9 damages recoverable in any other cause of action.
- Sec. 87A.004. APPLICABILITY. (a) This chapter does not
- 11 apply to the official act or omission of a nonprofit entity or a
- 12 governmental unit or to an employee or officer of a nonprofit entity
- 13 or governmental unit.
- 14 (b) This chapter may not be construed to provide for the
- 15 recovery of noneconomic damages from a licensed veterinarian in an
- 16 <u>action for veterinary malpractice or negligence.</u>
- 17 SECTION 2. Chapter 87A, Civil Practice and Remedies Code,
- 18 as added by this Act, applies only to conduct that takes place on or
- 19 after the effective date of this Act. Conduct that takes place
- 20 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in
- 21 effect immediately before that date, and that law is continued in
- 22 effect for that purpose.
- 23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
