4	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 51, Government Code, is

6	Sec. 51.008. FEES FOR PROCESS SERVER CERTIFICATION. (a)
7	The process server review board established by supreme court order
8	may recommend to the supreme court the fees to be charged for
9	process server certification and renewal of certification. The
10	supreme court must approve the fees recommended by the process
11	server review board before the fees may be collected.
12	(b) If a certification is issued or renewed for a term that
13	is less than the certification period provided by supreme court
14	rule, the fee for the certification shall be prorated so that the
15	process server pays only that portion of the fee that is allocable
16	to the period during which the certification is valid. On renewal
17	of the certification on the new expiration date, the process server
18	must pay the entire certification renewal fee.
19	(c) The Office of Court Administration of the Texas Judicial
20	System may collect the fees recommended by the process server

(d) Fees collected under this section may be appropriated to

the credit of the general revenue fund.

- 4 SECTION 2. (a) The fees recommended and approved under
- 5 Section 51.008, Government Code, as added by this Act, apply to:
- 6 (1) each person who holds a process server
- 7 certification on the effective date of this Act; and
- 8 (2) each person who applies for process serves
- 9 certification on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 10 (b) The Office of Court Administration of the Texas Judicial
- 11 System shall prorate the process server certification fee so that a
- 12 person who holds a process server certification on the effective
- 13 date of this Act pays only that portion of the fee that is allocable
- 14 to the period during which the certification is valid. On renewal
- 15 of the certification on the new expiration date, the entire
- 16 certification renewal fee is payable.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
