## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 Relating to the Early High School Graduation Scholarship Program.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 56.204(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:

- 6 Sec. 56.204. ENTITLEMENT. (a) Out of funds appropriated
- 7 for this purpose, the commissioner shall award an eligible person
- 8 under the Early High School Graduation Scholarship program [is
- 9 entitled to ]a state credit to apply toward tuition or tuition and
- 10 mandatory fees, as applicable, at a public or private institution
- 11 of higher education in this state in the following amounts:
- 12 (1) \$2,000 to apply toward tuition and mandatory fees
- 13 if the person successfully completed the recommended or advanced
- 14 high school program established under Section 28.025 and graduated
- 15 from high school on or after September 1, 2005, in 36 consecutive
- 16 months or less and an additional \$1,000 to apply toward tuition and
- 17 mandatory fees if the person graduated with at least 15 hours of
- 18 college credit;
- 19 (2) \$500 to apply toward tuition and mandatory fees if
- 20 the person successfully completed the recommended or advanced high
- 21 school program established under Section 28.025 and graduated from
- 22 high school on or after September 1, 2005, in more than 36
- 23 consecutive months but not more than 41 consecutive months and an
- 24 additional \$1,000 to apply toward tuition and mandatory fees if the

- 1 person graduated with at least 30 hours of college credit;
- 2 (3) \$1,000 to apply toward tuition and mandatory fees
- 3 if the person successfully completed the recommended or advanced
- 4 high school program established under Section 28.025 and graduated
- 5 from high school on or after September 1, 2005, in more than 41
- 6 consecutive months but not more than 45 consecutive months with at
- 7 least 30 hours of college credit; or
- 8 (4) \$1,000 to apply only toward tuition if the person
- 9 graduated before September 1, 2005, after successfully completing
- 10 the requirements for a high school diploma in not more than 36
- 11 consecutive months.
- 12 SECTION 2. Subsection 56.202(b) and Section 56.208,
- 13 Education Code, are repealed.
- 14 SECTION 3. The changes made by this Act apply to tuition and
- 15 fees charged beginning with the 2011 fall semester.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
