4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 70, Property Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter G to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER G. INTERIOR DESIGNER'S LIEN
8	Sec. 70.601. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
9	(1) "Interior design contract" means a writter
10	contract entered into with an interior design contractor.
11	(2) "Interior design contractor" means a person who
12	enters into an interior design contract to provide labor or
13	materials as an interior designer who holds a certificate of
14	registration under Chapter 1053, Occupations Code.
15	(3) "Interior environment" means the interior
16	environment or space identified in an interior design contract.
17	Sec. 70.602. INTERIOR DESIGNER'S LIEN. An interior design
18	contractor who provides labor or materials under an interior design
19	contract has a lien for the amount owed under the contract.
20	Sec. 70.603. PROPERTY TO WHICH LIEN ATTACHES. A lien under
21	Section 70.602 attaches to:
22	(1) personal property provided under the interior
23	design contract; and

(2) all non-exempt real property:

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(A) that is owned by a person who contracts with 1 2 an interior design contractor; and 3 (B) on which the interior environment is located. 4 Sec. 70.604. PERFECTING LIEN. An interior design 5 contractor claiming a lien under this subchapter may perfect a lien by filing a lien affidavit with the county clerk of the county in 6 7 which the real property on which the interior environment is 8 located. Sec. 70.605. CONTENTS OF AFFIDAVIT. (a) The affidavit 9 described by Section 70.604 must be a sworn statement signed by the 10 person claiming the lien or by another person on the claimant's 11 12 behalf and must contain: (1) the amount of the claim; 13 14 (2) the name and last known address of the owner or 15 reputed owner of the property on which the interior environment is 16 located; 17 (3) a general statement of the kind of labor done and materials provided by the claimant; 18 (4) a description, legally sufficient 19 identification, of the property sought to be charged with the lien; 20 21 and 22 (5) the claimant's name, mailing address, and, if different, physical address. 23 24 (b) The affidavit is not required to itemize individual items of labor or material provided under the interior design 25

- 2 claimant receives full payment of the amount owed to the claimant
- 3 <u>under the interior design contract.</u>
- 4 Sec. 70.607. APPLICABILITY OF OTHER LAW. Chapter 9,
- 5 Business & Commerce Code, including applicable filing and
- 6 perfection requirements, applies to a lien on personal property
- 7 <u>under this subchapter.</u>
- 8 SECTION 2. The changes to law made by this Act apply only to
- 9 an interior design contract, as described by Subchapter G, Chapter
- 10 70, Property Code, as added by this Act, entered into on or after
- 11 the effective date of this Act. A contract entered into before the
- 12 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect
- 13 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is
- 14 continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
