Section 37.126, Education Code, is amended by 11 12 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to read as follows: 13 14 (a) Except as provided by Section 37.125, a person commits an offense if the person intentionally disrupts, prevents, or 15 16 interferes with the lawful transportation of children: (1) to or from school on a vehicle owned or operated by 17 a county or independent school district; or 18 (2) to or from [or] an activity sponsored by a school 19 on a vehicle owned or operated by a county or independent school 20 21 district. (c) It is an exception to the application of Subsection 22 23 (a)(1) that the actor was younger than 13 years of age at the time the actor engaged in conduct prohibited under that subdivision. 24

SECTION 3. Section 42.01, Penal Code, is amended by adding
Subsection (f) to read as follows:

3 (f) It is an exception to the application of Subsections 4 (a)(1) through (6) that the actor was younger than 13 years of age 5 at the time the actor engaged in conduct prohibited under those 6 subdivisions and the prohibited conduct occurred at a public school 7 campus during regular school hours.

8 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act. 9 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is 10 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed, 11 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. 12 For purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the 13 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred 14 15 before that date.
