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	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to the licensing and regulation of professional fitness
3	trainers; providing a penalty.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle H, Title 3, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 456 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 456. PROFESSIONAL FITNESS TRAINERS
8	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
9	Sec. 456.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
10	(1) "Department" means the Department of State Health
11	Services.
12	(2) "Executive commissioner" means the executive
13	commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission.
14	(3) "Fitness equipment" includes weight-training
15	equipment and assessment tools, including calipers, scales, and
16	measuring tapes.
17	(4) "Licensed professional fitness trainer" means a
18	person who provides professional fitness training under a license
19	issued under this chapter.
20	(5) "Professional fitness training" means the
21	instruction of exercise and techniques to achieve physical fitness,
22	including:
23	(A) physical assessment and performance testing;
24	(B) manual stretching;

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1	(C) isometric and manual techniques to provide
2	improved muscle facilitation and increased range of motion;
3	(D) exercise selection, programming, and
4	techniques; and
5	(E) instruction on the safe use of fitness
6	equipment.
7	Sec. 456.002. APPLICABILITY OF CHAPTER. This chapter does
8	not apply to a person licensed in this state as a physician, nurse,
9	massage therapist, physical therapist, occupational therapist,
10	athletic trainer, or chiropractor.
11	Sec. 456.003. PRACTICES NOT INCLUDED IN PROFESSIONAL
12	FITNESS TRAINING. (a) The practice of a licensed physical fitness
13	trainer does not include an activity that would require the removal
14	of a client's clothing.
15	(b) In this chapter, professional fitness training does not
16	include a service or procedure that would require a license to
17	practice an occupation listed in Section 456.002.
18	Sec. 456.004. VOLUNTARY LICENSE; USE OF TITLE. (a) A
19	license issued under this chapter is not required to practice
20	professional fitness training.
21	(b) A person may not use the title "Licensed Professional
22	Fitness Trainer" unless the person holds a license issued under
23	this chapter.

25	SUBCHAPTER B. POWERS AND DUTIES OF EXECUTIVE COMMISSIONER
26	AND DEPARTMENT
27	Sec. 456.051. RULES. The executive commissioner shall

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1	adopt rules necessary to implement this chapter.
2	Sec. 456.052. CONTINUING EDUCATION. The department shall
3	recognize, prepare, or administer continuing education programs
4	for persons licensed under this chapter. A license holder must
5	participate in the programs as required by the executive
6	commissioner to renew a license.
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	Sec. 456.053. GENERAL DUTIES OF DEPARTMENT. The department
8	shall:
9	(1) administer this chapter;
10	(2) investigate a person who may be engaging in a
11	<pre>practice in violation of Section 456.004(b);</pre>
12	(3) establish criteria for the courses described by
13	Section 456.102(3); and
14	(4) approve schools or programs that offer the courses
15	described by Section 456.102(3).

17	SUBCHAPTER C. LICENSING
18	Sec. 456.101. LICENSE APPLICATION. An applicant for a
19	professional fitness trainer license must submit to the department:
20	(1) an application on a form prescribed by the
21	department; and
22	(2) the required fee.
23	Sec. 456.102. APPLICANT QUALIFICATIONS. An applicant for a
24	professional fitness trainer license must:
25	(1) be at least 18 years of age;
26	(2) have a current certification in first aid and
27	cardiopulmonary resuscitation; and

(3) have completed at least 250 hours of training or 1 2 instruction in the following courses: 3 (A) 25 hours of anatomy; 4 (B) 25 hours of physiology; 5 (C) 25 hours of kinesiology; (D) <u>10 hours of health and hygiene;</u> 6 7 (E) 10 hours of business basics; (F) 75 hours of practical instruction; and 8 (G) 80 hours in business, exercise training, 9 10 physical assessment, injury care and prevention, and physical 11 development. Sec. 456.103. LICENSE ISSUANCE. The department shall issue 12 a license to an applicant who meets the requirements of Section 13 14 456.102. 15 Sec. 456.104. LICENSE EXPIRATION; RENEWAL. (a) A license issued under Section 456.103 expires on the first anniversary of 16 17 the date of issuance. (b) A license holder <u>may renew an unexpired license by</u> 18 19 complying with rules adopted by the executive commissioner. (c) The executive commissioner by rule may adopt a system 20 under which licenses expire on various dates during the year. For 21 the year in which the license expiration date is changed, the 22 license fee shall be prorated on a monthly basis so that a license 23 24 holder pays only that portion of the license fee that is allocable to the number of months during which the license is valid. On 25 26 renewal of the license on the new expiration date, the total license renewal fee is payable. 27

2	SUBCHAPTER D. PROHIBITED PRACTICE
3	Sec. 456.151. PROHIBITED USE OF TITLE. (a) A person
4	commits an offense if the person violates Section 456.004(b).
5	(b) An offense under this section is a Class C misdemeanor.
6	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
