## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to the authority of the Ector County Hospital District to
- 3 employ and commission peace officers.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 1024, Special District
- 6 Local Laws Code, is amended by adding Section 1024.117 to read as
- 7 follows:
- 8 Sec. 1024.117. EMPLOYMENT OF DISTRICT PEACE OFFICERS. (a)
- 9 The board may employ and commission peace officers for the
- 10 district.
- 11 (b) The jurisdiction of a peace officer commissioned under
- 12 this section includes the property owned or controlled by the
- 13 district and any street abutting, right-of-way over or through, or
- 14 easement in the property.
- 15 (c) In a district peace officer's jurisdiction, the peace
- officer has the authority granted by Chapter 14, Code of Criminal
- 17 Procedure. The peace officer may also make an arrest without a
- 18 warrant in the officer's jurisdiction if the offense involves
- 19 injury or harm to any property owned or controlled by the district.
- 20 SECTION 2. Article 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 21 amended to read as follows:
- 22 Art. 2.12. WHO ARE PEACE OFFICERS. The following are peace
- 23 officers:
- 24 (1) sheriffs, their deputies, and those reserve

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- 1 deputies who hold a permanent peace officer license issued under
- 2 Chapter 1701, Occupations Code;
- 3 (2) constables, deputy constables, and those reserve
- 4 deputy constables who hold a permanent peace officer license issued
- 5 under Chapter 1701, Occupations Code;
- 6 (3) marshals or police officers of an incorporated
- 7 city, town, or village, and those reserve municipal police officers
- 8 who hold a permanent peace officer license issued under Chapter
- 9 1701, Occupations Code;
- 10 (4) rangers and officers commissioned by the Public
- 11 Safety Commission and the Director of the Department of Public
- 12 Safety;
- 13 (5) investigators of the district attorneys', criminal
- 14 district attorneys', and county attorneys' offices;
- 15 (6) law enforcement agents of the Texas Alcoholic
- 16 Beverage Commission;
- 17 (7) each member of an arson investigating unit
- 18 commissioned by a city, a county, or the state;
- 19 (8) officers commissioned under Section 37.081,
- 20 Education Code, or Subchapter E, Chapter 51, Education Code;
- 21 (9) officers commissioned by the General Services
- 22 Commission;
- 23 (10) law enforcement officers commissioned by the
- 24 Parks and Wildlife Commission;
- 25 (11) airport police officers commissioned by a city
- 26 with a population of more than 1.18 million that operates an airport
- 27 that serves commercial air carriers;

- 1 (12) airport security personnel commissioned as peace
- 2 officers by the governing body of any political subdivision of this
- 3 state, other than a city described by Subdivision (11), that
- 4 operates an airport that serves commercial air carriers;
- 5 (13) municipal park and recreational patrolmen and
- 6 security officers;
- 7 (14) security officers and investigators commissioned
- 8 as peace officers by the comptroller;
- 9 (15) officers commissioned by a water control and
- 10 improvement district under Section 49.216, Water Code;
- 11 (16) officers commissioned by a board of trustees
- 12 under Chapter 54, Transportation Code;
- 13 (17) investigators commissioned by the Texas Medical
- 14 Board;
- 15 (18) officers commissioned by:
- 16 <u>(A)</u> the board of managers of the Dallas County
- 17 Hospital District, the Tarrant County Hospital District, or the
- 18 Bexar County Hospital District under Section 281.057, Health and
- 19 Safety Code; and
- 20 (B) the board of directors of the Ector County
- 21 Hospital District under Section 1024.117, Special District Local
- 22 Laws Code;
- 23 (19) county park rangers commissioned under
- 24 Subchapter E, Chapter 351, Local Government Code;
- 25 (20) investigators employed by the Texas Racing
- 26 Commission;
- 27 (21) officers commissioned under Chapter 554,

- 1 Occupations Code;
- 2 (22) officers commissioned by the governing body of a
- 3 metropolitan rapid transit authority under Section 451.108,
- 4 Transportation Code, or by a regional transportation authority
- 5 under Section 452.110, Transportation Code;
- 6 (23) investigators commissioned by the attorney
- 7 general under Section 402.009, Government Code;
- 8 (24) security officers and investigators commissioned
- 9 as peace officers under Chapter 466, Government Code;
- 10 (25) an officer employed by the Department of State
- 11 Health Services under Section 431.2471, Health and Safety Code;
- 12 (26) officers appointed by an appellate court under
- 13 Subchapter F, Chapter 53, Government Code;
- 14 (27) officers commissioned by the state fire marshal
- 15 under Chapter 417, Government Code;
- 16 (28) an investigator commissioned by the commissioner
- 17 of insurance under Section 701.104, Insurance Code;
- 18 (29) apprehension specialists and inspectors general
- 19 commissioned by the Texas Youth Commission as officers under
- 20 Sections 61.0451 and 61.0931, Human Resources Code;
- 21 (30) officers appointed by the inspector general of
- 22 the Texas Department of Criminal Justice under Section 493.019,
- 23 Government Code;
- 24 (31) investigators commissioned by the Commission on
- 25 Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education under Section
- 26 1701.160, Occupations Code;
- 27 (32) commission investigators commissioned by the

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- 1 Texas Private Security Board under Section 1702.061(f),
- 2 Occupations Code;
- 3 (33) the fire marshal and any officers, inspectors, or
- 4 investigators commissioned by an emergency services district under
- 5 Chapter 775, Health and Safety Code;
- 6 (34) officers commissioned by the State Board of
- 7 Dental Examiners under Section 254.013, Occupations Code, subject
- 8 to the limitations imposed by that section;
- 9 (35) investigators commissioned by the Texas Juvenile
- 10 Probation Commission as officers under Section 141.055, Human
- 11 Resources Code; and
- 12 (36) the fire marshal and any related officers,
- 13 inspectors, or investigators commissioned by a county under
- 14 Subchapter B, Chapter 352, Local Government Code.
- 15 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
