- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 152.0031, Human Resources Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 152.0031. APPLICATION OF SUBCHAPTER. Except as
- 7 otherwise provided by this chapter, this [This] subchapter does not
- 8 apply to a county that is served by a juvenile board created under
- 9 Subchapter C or D.
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 152.0801, Human Resources Code, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 152.0801. FANNIN COUNTY. [(a)] The Fannin County
- 13 Juvenile Board is governed by Subchapter B [composed of the county
- 14 judge and the district judges in Fannin County].
- 15 [(b) The juvenile court judge is the chairman of the board
- 16 and its chief administrative officer.
- 17 [(c) The county commissioners court may pay the juvenile
- 18 board chairman additional annual compensation of \$1,200 for the
- 19 added duties imposed on the chairman. The commissioners court may
- 20 pay the other members of the board additional annual compensation
- 21 of not more than \$1,200. The additional compensation shall be paid
- 22 in equal monthly installments from the general fund or any other
- 23 available fund of the county.
- 24 [(d) The commissioners court shall certify all claims for

- 1 expenses of the juvenile probation officer as necessary in the
- 2 performance of the officer's duties. The commissioners court shall
- 3 provide the necessary funds to pay the salaries and expenses of the
- 4 juvenile probation officer.
- 5 [(e) Sections 152.0002, 152.0004, 152.0005, 152.0006,
- 6 152.0007, and 152.0008 do not apply to the juvenile board of Fannin
- 7 County.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
