CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The Tenth Amendment to the United 2 Constitution places clear limits on the reach of the federal government; however, through the years, the U.S. Congress has 3 seized upon the Interstate Commerce Clause in Article 1, Section 8 4 5 of the Constitution as justification for methodically expanding its own powers; and 6

7 WHEREAS, The Interstate Commerce Clause provides that Congress shall have only the authority "[t] o regulate Commerce with 8 foreign Nations, and among the several States, and with the Indian 9 Tribes" and should not be used to provide Congress with powers 10 11 those originally intended by the framers beyond 12 Constitution, such as the establishment of regulations, agencies, 13 and government programs that usurp the duties and responsibilities 14 reserved for the states by the Tenth Amendment; now, therefore, be 15 it

RESOLVED, That the 82nd Legislature of the State of Texas
hereby respectfully urge the Congress of the United States to
reaffirm its commitment to the Tenth Amendment of the United States
Constitution by returning to the states the many duties and
responsibilities reserved to them; and, be it further

of the United States to abolish, in an orderly and expeditious
fashion, within a time span not to exceed 10 years, the Department

- 1 Commerce, the Occupational Safety and Health Administration, the
- 2 Department of Health and Human Services, and the Department of
- 3 Labor; and, be it further
- 4 RESOLVED, That the 82nd Texas Legislature urge the Congress
- 5 of the United States to reduce the federal income tax by an amount
- 6 equal to the cost savings associated with the abolition of these
- 7 agencies, to commit to never usurping the rights of the states in
- 8 any future legislation, and to refrain from exempting itself from
- 9 any legislation it so passes; and, be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That the Texas secretary of state forward official
- 11 copies of this resolution to the president of the United States, to
- 12 the president of the Senate and the speaker of the House of
- 13 Representatives of the United States Congress, and to all the
- 14 members of the Texas delegation to Congress with the request that
- 15 this resolution be entered in the Congressional Record as a
- 16 memorial to the Congress of the United States of America.
