A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment requiring certain tax bills to
- 2 be approved by two-thirds of all the members elected to each house
- 3 of the legislature.
- 4 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Article VIII, Texas Constitution, is amended by
- 6 adding Section 25 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 25. (a) An affirmative record vote of two-thirds of
- 8 all the members elected to each house of the legislature on final
- 9 consideration in each house is required for passage of a bill that:
- 10 (1) imposes a new state tax; or
- 11 (2) increases the rate of an existing state tax above
- 12 the rate in effect on the date the bill was filed.
- 13 (b) This section does not apply to a bill that amends:
- 14 (1) the manner in which a state tax is computed;
- 15 (2) the manner in which a state tax is administered or
- 16 enforced; or
- 17 <u>(3)</u> the applicability of a state tax.
- 18 <u>(c) In this section, "state tax" does not include:</u>
- 19 (1) a tax or other levy imposed by a political
- 20 <u>subdivision of this state;</u>
- 21 (2) a fine, penalty, or interest charge;
- 22 (3) a charge for a specific service, property, or
- 23 other item in an amount that reasonably relates to the value of the
- 24 service, property, or item; or

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- 1 (4) a fee, including a filing fee, license or
- 2 <u>registration fee, or application fee.</u>
- 3 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- 4 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 8, 2011.
- 5 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the
- 6 proposition: "The constitutional amendment requiring a bill that
- 7 imposes or increases the rate of a state tax to be approved by
- 8 two-thirds of all the members elected to each house of the
- 9 legislature."
