A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 proposing a constitutional amendment to dedicate net revenue from
- 2 the state lottery to support educational programs that benefit
- 3 classroom teaching in the state's public schools and to prohibit
- 4 certain lottery advertisements and promotions.
- 5 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 47, Article III, Texas Constitution, is
- 7 amended by amending Subsection (e) and adding Subsection (f) to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 (e) The Legislature by general law may authorize the State
- 10 to operate lotteries and may authorize the State to enter into a
- 11 contract with one or more legal entities that will operate
- 12 lotteries on behalf of the State. All money received by the State
- 13 from the operation of lotteries, other than amounts paid for
- 14 administrative costs, unclaimed lottery prizes, and amounts paid
- 15 for lottery prizes, is dedicated to and may be expended only for the
- 16 enrichment of educational programs of the State's public primary
- 17 and secondary schools and only for items that directly benefit
- 18 classroom teaching, including teacher compensation and the
- 19 acquisition of textbooks and educational supplies, materials,
- 20 <u>equipment</u>, and services.
- 21 (f) An advertisement or promotion sponsored by the State or
- 22 <u>a holder of a license issued by the State and related to the</u>
- 23 operation of a lottery authorized by Subsection (e) of this section
- 24 may not encourage or attempt to influence a person to purchase a

- 1 lottery ticket or number by stating that revenue generated from the
- 2 sale of the ticket or number will be used to support or provide
- 3 additional funds to the State's public primary or secondary
- 4 schools.
- 5 SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be
- 6 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 8, 2011.
- 7 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the
- 8 proposition: "The constitutional amendment to dedicate net revenue
- 9 from the state lottery to support educational programs that benefit
- 10 classroom teaching in the state's public schools and to prohibit
- 11 advertisements and promotions that state the revenue generated by
- 12 the sale of lottery tickets or numbers is used to financially assist
- 13 public schools."
