A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 applying to the Congress of the United States to call a convention
- 2 to propose an amendment to the United States Constitution to
- 3 require a balanced federal budget.
- WHEREAS, The gravity of federal debt and federal obligations
- 5 was established early in American history, with deficits occurring
- 6 only in relation to extraordinary circumstances such as war; yet
- 7 for much of the 20th century and into the 21st, the United States
- 8 has operated on a budget deficit, including the 2010 budget year,
- 9 which surpassed an astounding \$1.3 trillion, an annual deficit that
- 10 exceeded the entire gross state product of Texas; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The federal debt is greater than \$14 trillion, a sum
- 12 that if shared equally by each person in America would be a burden
- 13 of over \$45,000 per person, and yet the federal government
- 14 continues to accrue debt; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The higher the deficit becomes, the more the
- 16 government must pay in interest on the debt, and the use of deficit
- 17 spending by the federal government compounds the problem of the
- 18 national debt, which becomes the responsibility of future
- 19 generations of Americans without their consent; and
- WHEREAS, Many states have previously requested that Congress
- 21 propose a constitutional amendment requiring a balanced budget, but
- 22 Congress has proven to be unresponsive; anticipating situations in
- 23 which Congress at times could fail to act, the drafters of the
- 24 United States Constitution had the foresight to adopt the language

- 1 in Article V that establishes that on application of the
- 2 legislatures of two-thirds of the several states, Congress shall
- 3 call a convention for proposing amendments; and
- 4 WHEREAS, A balanced budget amendment would require the
- 5 government not to spend more than it receives in revenue and compel
- 6 lawmakers to carefully consider choices about spending and taxes;
- 7 by encouraging spending control and discouraging deficit spending,
- 8 a balanced budget amendment will help put the nation on the path to
- 9 lasting prosperity; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The United States Constitution contains no
- 11 restriction on the power of the federal government to incur a budget
- 12 deficit; and
- WHEREAS, Article V of the United States Constitution provides
- 14 that on application of the legislatures of two-thirds of the
- 15 several states Congress shall call a convention for proposing
- 16 amendments to the constitution; now, therefore, be it
- 17 RESOLVED, That the 82nd Texas Legislature apply to Congress
- 18 to call a convention under Article V of the United States
- 19 Constitution for the exclusive purpose of proposing an amendment to
- 20 the constitution providing that except in time of war or other
- 21 national emergency the total of all federal appropriations for a
- 22 fiscal year may not exceed the total of all estimated federal
- 23 revenue for that fiscal year; and, be it further
- 24 RESOLVED, That the 82nd Texas Legislature request Congress to
- 25 propose and submit to the states for ratification an amendment to
- 26 the constitution to provide for a balanced federal budget; and, be
- 27 it further

rescinded 1 RESOLVED, That, unless bу succeeding а legislature, this application by the 82nd Texas Legislature 2 3 constitutes a continuing application in accordance with Article V of the United States Constitution until at least two-thirds of the 4 5 legislatures of the several states have applied to Congress to call a convention to propose an amendment to the constitution to provide 6 for a balanced federal budget, but if Congress proposes and submits 7 8 to the states for ratification a constitutional amendment identical in subject matter to that contained in this resolution, this 9 10 application is no longer of any force; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That this application is rescinded in the event that a convention to propose amendments to the United States Constitution includes purposes other than providing for a balanced federal budget; and, be it further
