RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Many notable citizens of Lubbock are visiting Austin

2 on January 25, 2011, to pay tribute to their city's rich heritage

3 and to celebrate Lubbock Day at the State Capitol; and

WHEREAS, A thriving region of the state, the Lubbock area is

5 one of the oldest inhabited places in Texas; archeologists have

6 discovered evidence of some 12,000 years of continuous habitation

7 at the Lubbock Lake Landmark site, a national historic and state

8 archeological preserve; and

9 WHEREAS, The City of Lubbock was incorporated more than 100

10 years ago on March 16, 1909; the railroads stimulated the city's

11 growth as a trade center, but residents also wanted the benefits of

12 an institution of higher learning; when legislation creating Texas

13 Technological College was finally passed in 1923, the site

14 selection committee, impressed by the enthusiasm and hospitality of

15 its citizens, chose Lubbock for its location; and

16 WHEREAS, Today a city of approximately 220,000 people,

17 Lubbock is home to the Texas Tech University System and its flagship

18 institution, Texas Tech University, a university well deserving of

19 tier one status; and

20 WHEREAS, Lubbock enjoys a diverse economy that draws its

21 strength from agribusiness, manufacturing, and commerce, as well as

22 from educational and medical facilities, boasting the largest

23 medical infrastructure between Dallas and Phoenix; with the growth

24 of cotton culture on the High Plains, Lubbock has become one of the

- 1 world's primary centers for the processing of cottonseed and hybrid
- 2 grain sorghum seed; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Lubbock also offers a wealth of cultural and
- 4 recreational opportunities, including the Lubbock Symphony
- 5 Orchestra, the Lubbock Civic Ballet, the Museum and Planetarium of
- 6 Texas Tech University, the Silent Wings Museum, and many other
- 7 cultural offerings at Texas Tech University; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Those wanting a glimpse of the frontier can find it
- 9 in the restored structures at the Ranching Heritage Center, a
- 10 15-acre site tracing the evolution of ranch architecture and the
- 11 history of the cattle industry; the region's history is also
- 12 celebrated at the American Museum of Agriculture; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The talented musicians who have come from the
- 14 Lubbock area include Buddy Holly, Roy Orbison, the Maines family,
- 15 Virgil Johnson and the Velvets, Waylon Jennings, Tanya Tucker, Joe
- 16 Ely, Jimmie Dale Gilmore, and Butch Hancock; their rich and diverse
- 17 contributions have earned Lubbock recognition as "The Music
- 18 Crossroads of Texas"; and
- WHEREAS, Lubbock's business community is represented by the
- 20 largest business federation on the Texas South Plains, the Lubbock
- 21 Chamber of Commerce, which is one of fewer than 70 chambers of
- 22 commerce to be accredited at the five star level by the U.S. Chamber
- 23 of Commerce; and
- WHEREAS, Among the delegation visiting the Capitol today are
- 25 proud members of the Leadership Lubbock Class of 2010-2011 and
- 26 Focus Lubbock Class of 2010-2011, who represent the future business
- 27 and community leaders of Lubbock; and
