

R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, Judge Brad Bradley is being honored by *Southlake*
2 *Style* magazine with its Community Impact Award on January 27, 2011;
3 and

4 WHEREAS, Born in Peabody, Massachusetts, Judge Bradley
5 graduated from Northeastern University and went on to attend the
6 New England School of Law; after completing his legal studies at
7 Southern Methodist University's Dedman School of Law in 1978, he
8 opened the first law office in Southlake, and he remains a partner
9 in the firm of Bradley Luce Bradley, R.L.L.P.; and

10 WHEREAS, Entering public service early in his career, Judge
11 Bradley became an assistant criminal district attorney for Tarrant
12 County and then an assistant attorney general for the State of
13 Texas; in 1987, he became presiding judge in Southlake's municipal
14 court, and during a tenure that spanned 14 years, he established the
15 court of record and created the Southlake/Carroll Independent
16 School District Teen Court and the Metroport Teen Court, allowing
17 juvenile misdemeanor offenders to satisfy their obligations
18 through community service and involvement in the judicial process;
19 and

20 WHEREAS, He has also served as a presiding judge and
21 associate judge for a number of municipal courts, and he presently
22 serves as presiding judge in Westlake and Haslet and as associate
23 judge in Grapevine and Trophy Club; he has held leadership roles in
24 such professional organizations as the American Bar Association,

1 the American Judges Association, and the Texas Municipal Courts
2 Association, and he has performed pro bono services for a host of
3 worthy groups; and

4 WHEREAS, Through the years, Judge Bradley has worked
5 tirelessly for the betterment of Southlake, Northeast Tarrant
6 County, and North Texas; he founded numerous business groups and
7 civic organizations, among them the Southlake Chamber of Commerce,
8 the Southlake Executive Forum, the Southlake Economic Development
9 Council, the Northeast Leadership Forum, Keep Southlake Beautiful,
10 Inc., and Environmental Task Force, which initiated the city's
11 curbside recycling program; in 1996, he formed the Carroll
12 Education Foundation to benefit the Carroll Independent School
13 District, and he served as its first chair; today, he serves as
14 director emeritus of the organization, which has donated more than
15 \$900,000 in grants to teachers and scholarships for graduating
16 seniors; and

17 WHEREAS, Judge Bradley initiated a sister cities program that
18 has brought about cultural, economic, and educational exchanges
19 with Tome City, Japan, El Fuerte, Mexico, and Wuzhong, China; in the
20 late 1990s, he cofounded Summer Santa, which is now one of the
21 largest children's charities in North Texas; his most recent
22 philanthropy, the Pro Players Foundation, teams professional
23 athletes with community volunteers in a variety of programs to
24 assist area youth; selected Man of the Year by the Southlake Chamber
25 of Commerce in 1989, he has additionally been named one of the
26 Pacesetters for Tarrant County by the *Fort Worth Star-Telegram* and
27 has received the Northeast Leadership Forum's Distinguished

1 Community Service Award; Governor Rick Perry commissioned him as an
2 Admiral in the Texas Navy in 2002; and

3 WHEREAS, A dynamic leader who inspires others to participate
4 in civic life and charitable endeavors, Judge Brad Bradley has made
5 enormous contributions to Tarrant County, and his accomplishments
6 indeed merit special recognition; now, therefore, be it

7 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 82nd Texas
8 Legislature hereby congratulate Judge Brad Bradley on his receipt
9 of the *Southlake Style* Community Impact Award and extend to him
10 sincere best wishes for continued success; and, be it further

11 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
12 prepared for Judge Bradley as an expression of high regard by the
13 Texas House of Representatives.
