RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The Angleton Area Emergency Medical Corps 2 celebrated 30 years of service to the citizens of Brazoria County in 3 2010; and

WHEREAS, Founded as a nonprofit corporation in 1980 by a 4 5 group of committed volunteers, Angleton Area Emergency Medical Corps was created out of a critical need for first responder 6 7 services in the local community; initially using a borrowed ambulance, the organization quickly grew and modernized, providing 8 9 advanced life support care beginning in 1984 and achieving mobile intensive care status the following year; currently, AAEMC utilizes 10 11 four ambulances, two command vehicles, and a special operations 12 trailer, as well as both paid and volunteer staff; the service region encompasses Angleton and about 400 square miles of Brazoria 13 14 County, and AAEMC staff responded to more than 3,200 calls in 2010; 15 and

WHEREAS, Along with emergency aid, the organization also 16 provides disaster assistance, running drills with other agencies 17 throughout southeastern Texas to ensure preparedness in the event 18 of a large-scale catastrophe; in addition, AAEMC trains community 19 members in injury prevention, first aid, and CPR, and it works with 20 21 the Angleton Independent School District to teach students lifesaving skills and to educate them on the dangers of drunk 22 23 driving; and
