RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Residents of McAllen are gathering at the State 2 Capitol on February 1, 2011, to celebrate their community's 3 contributions to the vitality of the Lone Star State; and

WHEREAS, The development of present-day McAllen began in 1797 when Spanish settler Jose Manuel Gomez founded the Santa Anita Ranch in what is now southern Hidalgo County; the ranch grew in size and was eventually inherited by Mr. Gomez's great-granddaughter, Salome Balli, who married John McAllen; together they continued to add to the property and renamed it McAllen Ranch; and

WHEREAS, In 1904, the St. Louis, Brownsville, and Mexico Railroad arrived, and that same year, Mr. McAllen and other early settlers established the McAllen Townsite Company, along with a community named for John McAllen; other developers founded East McAllen in 1907, and the two towns eventually merged and became home to several businesses, churches, residences, and a newspaper; by 1920, the city was home to some 6,000 residents; and

WHEREAS, Over the last four decades, McAllen has grown into a 17 center for business, commerce, and government in the Rio Grande 18 Valley, and it is part of one of the fastest-growing metropolitan 19 statistical areas in the country; in 2009, Forbes magazine ranked 20 21 McAllen as the top mid-sized city in the nation for population and job growth; CNNMoney.com has listed McAllen as one of the best 22 places in the country to live and invest, and Moody's Analytics 23 ranked the city number one for job growth for 2008-2013; such 24

1 designations continue a trend of recognition for McAllen dating
2 back to at least 1996, when it was named an All-America City; and

WHEREAS, A vibrant cultural center, McAllen is home to the 3 International Museum of Art and Science, which serves as a showcase 4 5 for traveling exhibitions, loaned works from the Smithsonian Institution, and an extensive collection of Latin American folk 6 art; the city's newly created Arts District holds regular art 7 8 walks, drawing thousands of art enthusiasts monthly; McAllen is also a regional hub for banking, shopping, and conventions, thanks 9 to La Plaza Mall and the recently opened \$75 million convention 10 center; moreover, a 123,000-square-foot public library 11 is 12 scheduled for completion in summer 2011; and

WHEREAS, Visitors and residents alike enjoy such festive annual events as the Candlelight Posada, the Fourth of July Celebration, and PalmFest, and in 2010, the city celebrated its third annual New Year's Eve bash, a free, community-wide event; and

WHEREAS, During 2011, the citizens of McAllen are celebrating the city's 100th anniversary as a municipality, and they may indeed take great pride in their city, which has played a significant role in the annals of Texas history; now, therefore, be it
