- 1 WHEREAS, A full and generous life drew to a close with the
- 2 passing of the Reverend Dr. Lawrence A. Crenshaw of San Antonio on
- 3 December 18, 2010, at the age of 86; and
- WHEREAS, The son of Etha Mae Winn and Marcus Crenshaw,
- 5 Lawrence Crenshaw was born in Caldwell County on March 4, 1924; he
- 6 grew up learning the value of hard work on his family's 239-acre
- 7 farm, where he chopped wood, hauled water, milked cows, picked
- 8 cotton, and stripped sugarcane; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Dr. Crenshaw decided at an early age to dedicate his
- 10 life to the ministry; after graduating from St. John School in Dale,
- 11 he attended Conroe College and Mary Allen College, earning
- 12 bachelor's and master's degrees in theology and divinity as well as
- 13 a doctorate in divinity; and
- 14 WHEREAS, During his more than six decades as a pastor,
- 15 Reverend Crenshaw shared his knowledge, wisdom, and spiritual
- 16 guidance with many congregations, serving churches in Navasota,
- 17 Littig, and Round Rock; and
- WHEREAS, In 1953, he was called to lead Palestine Baptist
- 19 Church in San Antonio, and through the years, he revitalized the
- 20 house of worship by creating new outreach ministries to serve
- 21 members and area residents in need; under his leadership, the
- 22 congregation built a new facility and spread a message of hope to
- 23 the greater public through radio and television broadcasts; and
- 24 WHEREAS, In addition to his work with Palestine Baptist,

- 1 Dr. Crenshaw served his community of faith as a Bible instructor
- 2 with Guadalupe College and as vice president and president of the
- 3 Sunday School and BYBU Congress; he also held offices on local,
- 4 state, and national levels and as chair of the permanent
- 5 organization committee, co-chair of the pastor's conference, vice
- 6 chair of the finance committee, and historian for the district
- 7 association; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Reverend Crenshaw exchanged wedding vows with
- 9 Estella Washington on September 17, 1947, and the couple had a
- 10 rewarding marriage that spanned more than half a century; after his
- 11 wife's passing, he was fortunate enough to find love a second time,
- 12 and in 2007 he married Mattie Johnson, with whom he shared a special
- 13 enjoyment of traveling; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Dr. Lawrence Crenshaw was a gifted and devoted
- 15 pastor who made a profound difference in the lives of those who had
- 16 the privilege of hearing him preach, and although he is deeply
- 17 missed, he leaves behind a legacy that will be treasured for years
- 18 to come; now, therefore, be it
- 19 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 82nd Texas
- 20 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of the Reverend
- 21 Dr. Lawrence A. Crenshaw and extend sincere sympathy to the members
- 22 of his family: to his wife, Mattie Crenshaw; to his sisters, Cleola
- 23 Franks, Rosa Lee Taylor, Ophelia Knox, Dee Dee Bennett, Effie Kemp,
- 24 and Julia Crenshaw-Moore and her husband, Willie; and to his other
- 25 relatives and friends; and, be it further
