3 of Frances Gail Sears of Kerrville, who passed away on December 31,

4 2010, at the age of 75; and

5 WHEREAS, A native of San Antonio, Gail Sears was born on

6 November 12, 1935, to Frances and Hugh McWilliams; she graduated

7 from Tivy High School and majored in drama at The University of

8 Texas at Austin, where she met her husband, Michael Edwin Sears; the

9 couple shared 54 years together and were blessed with two

10 daughters, Kathy and Kari; and

11 WHEREAS, Mrs. Sears was active in her children's education

12 and dedicated to improving life for area youth; in addition to

serving as president of the Notre Dame Catholic School Board, she

14 was a valued member of the PTA, and she volunteered to drive a bus so

15 that West Kerr County students could attend school in Kerrville;

16 she also helped to found the Community Service Council, a group that

17 teaches dance and drama to disadvantaged children, and served as a

18 liaison for the March of Dimes, driving her own car to transport

19 young patients and their parents to San Antonio; and

WHEREAS, In the early 1970s, Mrs. Sears began teaching an

21 exercise class for her friends at Holy Cross Lutheran Church;

22 discovering a passion for health and fitness, she went on to found

23 Gail's Aerobic Lifestyle, offering classes at the Municipal

24 Auditorium; she later opened her own storefront, the Center for

- 2 expanded to include another location in 2004; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Mrs. Sears earned certifications from the Cooper
- 4 Institute, American Council on Exercise, and Ron Fletcher Program
- 5 of Study for Pilates; known for her expertise and enthusiasm, she
- 6 developed workout programs for employees at local businesses and
- 7 conducted seminars for area firefighters and law enforcement
- 8 officers; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Through the years, she was awarded a number of
- 10 accolades for her efforts to enrich her community, including the
- 11 titles of Woman of the Year from the Kerr County Women's Chamber of
- 12 Commerce and Hill Country Life Treasure from the Kerrville Daily
- 13 Times; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Mrs. Sears treasured her faith and served the Rite
- 15 of Christian Initiation of Adults as a lector, sponsor, and choir
- 16 member; she also shared her time with the Catholic Youth
- 17 Organization and Marriage Encounter, participated in liturgical
- 18 dance, and taught Sunday school; in her free time, she enjoyed
- 19 gardening and painting as well as making props, sewing costumes,
- 20 and acting in performances produced by the Hill Country Arts
- 21 Foundation; and
- WHEREAS, Although the death of Gail Sears has brought great
- 23 sorrow to those who loved her, she demonstrated what a positive
- 24 difference one committed individual can make in the lives of
- 25 others, and she will long be remembered with deep admiration and
