WHEREAS, In 1964, she returned again to San Antonio to marry Calvin Dudley, forging a fulfilling relationship that endured until her death; together they were blessed with three children, Trena Robinson, E. Warren Dudley, and Lura Dudley, as well as two grandchildren, Bria and James; and
