RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, April 9, 2011, is being celebrated as Welcome Home 2 South Texas Vietnam Veterans Day and is being commemorated at the Landing Zone For Troops in the Rio Grande Valley (LZ:RGV), an 3 all-day series of events designed to acknowledge and thank veterans 4 5 of the Vietnam War; and 6 WHEREAS, The conflict in Southeast Asia was a divisive time 7 in our nation's history, and Vietnam veterans often returned home to little fanfare; due to the controversy surrounding the war, they 8 rarely received the gratitude and respect they deserved; the LZ:RGV 9

is intended to correct that lack of recognition and to officially 10 11 welcome a number of Vietnam veterans back home to South Texas; and 12 WHEREAS, Communities from across the Rio Grande Valley have united in support of the LZ:RGV, and many organizations and 13 14 individuals are working to make it a success; sponsors include the American Legion, the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the Veterans 15 Alliance of the Rio Grande Valley, the Rio Grande Guardian, The 16 Monitor, the City of McAllen, the City of Edinburg, Total Imaging 17 Solutions, Entravision Communications Corporation, and Hidalgo 18

20 WHEREAS, The celebration is being held at the McAllen 21 Convention Center, which was offered at no charge for the event, and 22 up to 15,000 people are expected to attend; beginning with a 23 dedication ceremony at the Veterans War Memorial of Texas, adjacent

- 2 veterans is being featured, followed by a closing concert; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Of the 2.59 million Americans who answered their
- 4 nation's call to duty during the Vietnam War, more than 58,000
- 5 sacrificed their lives, among them 3,400 Texans; many more
- 6 thousands of military personnel were wounded, with 75,000 severely
- 7 disabled; in addition, a large number of men were held as POWs, and
- 8 today, approximately 2,000 Americans who served in the war remain
- 9 missing; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Brave and steadfast during one of the most difficult
- 11 conflicts in this nation's history, Vietnam War veterans are worthy
- 12 of our utmost respect and appreciation, and this extensive
- 13 celebration justly honors their courageous efforts; now,
- 14 therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 82nd Texas
- 16 Legislature hereby recognize April 9, 2011, as Welcome Home South
- 17 Texas Vietnam Veterans Day and pay tribute to those area Texans who
- 18 served their country during the Vietnam War.
