

R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, The city of Arlington lost an admired civic leader
2 with the death of its longtime first lady, Anna Waynette
3 Vandergriff, on July 4, 2009, at the age of 82; and

4 WHEREAS, An Arlington native, the former Anna Waynette Smith
5 was born on June 12, 1927, to Gladys Parker Smith and Thomas Wayne
6 Smith; her interest in music began early in life, and as a young
7 woman she directed the Arlington High School choir in University
8 Interscholastic League competitions and played the organ at local
9 churches; after graduating, she earned an associate's degree from
10 The University of Texas at Arlington and served as secretary to the
11 chair of the fine arts department; she subsequently received a
12 scholarship to Texas Christian University, where she worked as a
13 piano instructor and accompanist while studying piano and flute;
14 and

15 WHEREAS, This engaging Texan won the heart of classmate Tom
16 Vandergriff while singing "Moonlight Becomes You" at an Arlington
17 High School assembly, and the couple went on to marry on March 19,
18 1949, in a ceremony at First Methodist Church; they later became the
19 parents of five children, Vanessa, Victor, Valerie, Viveca, and
20 Vaughn, and Mrs. Vandergriff raised the couple's children to share
21 her passion for the arts; she eventually welcomed five
22 grandchildren into the family as well and took great pleasure in
23 watching them grow up; and

24 WHEREAS, While meeting the needs of her family, Mrs.

1 Vandergriff also worked tirelessly in behalf of the greater good;
2 equally committed to a life of public service, she supported her
3 husband in his role as president of the chamber of commerce, as the
4 13-term mayor of Arlington, as a United States congressman, and as a
5 Tarrant County judge even as she undertook such endeavors as
6 helping to organize the city's first community concert series and
7 serving on the board of the Dance Theatre of Arlington; with energy
8 and enthusiasm, she further benefited a number of other
9 organizations, including the Arlington Junior League, the Women's
10 Shelter, and the Arlington Newcomers Club as an advisory board
11 member, and chaired the city's first Mothers' March on Polio for the
12 March of Dimes; moreover, she hosted numerous open houses to raise
13 funds for cultural and charitable organizations and chaired the UTA
14 National Alumni Association fund drive in 1984; and

15 WHEREAS, Anna Waynette Vandergriff was a pillar of her
16 community and brought joy to many through her caring and fun-loving
17 personality; those who were privileged to know her will forever
18 treasure their memories of her dedication to her family, her
19 friends, and her hometown; now, therefore, be it

20 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 82nd Texas
21 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the life of Anna Waynette
22 Vandergriff and extend sincere sympathy to the members of her
23 family: to her husband of 60 years, Tom Vandergriff; to her
24 children, Victor Vandergriff, Vanessa Watters, Valerie Kelton, and
25 Viveca Vandergriff; to her grandchildren; and to her other
26 relatives and friends; and, be it further
