RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Residents of the Texas Panhandle are gathering in Austin on February 22, 2011, to pay tribute to their region's rich 2 heritage and to celebrate Panhandle Day at the State Capitol; and 3 4 WHEREAS, One of the oldest inhabited areas of Texas, where vast grasslands once thrived, the Panhandle is crossed by the 5 6 Canadian and Red Rivers, rests over the southern tip of the Ogallala Aguifer, and offers breathtaking views of Palo Duro Canyon; in the 7 8 1880s, three million acres of Panhandle land that was traded by the 9 state to finance construction of a new Texas Capitol became known as

10 the XIT Ranch; and WHEREAS, Ranching became central to the Panhandle's culture 11 12 and economy in the late 19th century, and the arrival of the 13 railroads and dryland farming techniques expanded the role of wheat and cotton farming; the discovery of oil and natural gas in the 14 15 1920s further diversified the economic base, and today, ranching, farming, and the petroleum industry continue to be important to the 16 17 region; and

WHEREAS, Amarillo, in Potter and Randall Counties, 18 essential to the prosperity of the Panhandle with Tyson Foods, Bell 19 Helicopter, B&W Pantex, and two health care systems all serving as 20 major employers; in addition to the city of Hereford, which is 21 22 regarded by many as the "Beef Capital of the World," other bedrock 23 communities in the Panhandle include Borger, Cactus, Canyon, 24 Childress, Clarendon, Dalhart, Dumas, Groom, Gruver, Pampa, Panhandle, Plainview, Skellytown, Stratford, 25 Texhoma, and

- 2 WHEREAS, The Panhandle is home to such premier educational
- 3 institutions as the Texas Tech University System, with its schools
- 4 of medicine and pharmacy, and West Texas A&M University, both of
- 5 which boast nationally recognized programs and faculty; Amarillo
- 6 College and South Plains College continue to be among the finest
- 7 community colleges in the country, and Wayland Baptist University,
- 8 Frank Phillips College, and Clarendon College also offer an
- 9 outstanding education; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Visitors and residents alike enjoy a range of
- 11 attractions, including the Panhandle-Plains Historical Museum, the
- 12 largest history museum in Texas, as well as the Amarillo Museum of
- 13 Art, the public art installation Cadillac Ranch, and the American
- 14 Quarter Horse Association's international headquarters; other
- 15 cultural assets include the Lone Star Ballet and the Amarillo
- 16 Symphony; and
- WHEREAS, Renowned for their hospitality, strong work ethic,
- 18 and resilience, the citizens of the Texas Panhandle may take great
- 19 pride in all they have done to make their region one of the
- 20 treasures of the Lone Star State, and it is a pleasure to pay
- 21 tribute to the Panhandle of Texas and the region's fine residents;
- 22 now, therefore, be it
- 23 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 82nd Texas
- 24 Legislature hereby recognize February 22, 2011, as Panhandle Day at
- 25 the State Capitol and extend to the visiting guests sincere best
- 26 wishes for a meaningful and memorable stay in Austin.
