RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Osteopathic physicians from across the Lone Star
State are gathering in Austin on February 23, 2011, to commemorate
Osteopathic Medicine Day at the State Capitol; and

WHEREAS, Osteopathic physicians are committed to meeting the needs of the whole person and the whole family, and they share the philosophical belief that home, work, and spiritual and social environments have a significant impact on a patient's health and well-being; and

WHEREAS, Osteopathic medical students from Texas study at 9 many osteopathic medical schools across the country, and 728 10 students are currently enrolled at the University of North Texas 11 12 Health Science Center's Texas College of Osteopathic Medicine; these students, upon graduation, will enter primary care 13 specialties in numbers well above the national and state averages 14 for medical school programs, and many go on to offer primary care 15 16 through family, general, internal medicine, OB/GYN, and pediatric 17 practices; they also provide preventive and public health services, as well as an entire spectrum of specialty care; there are currently 18 nearly 4,000 licensed osteopathic physicians in Texas, including 19 growing numbers of women and Hispanic, Asian, and African American 20 21 doctors; and

22 WHEREAS, Texas osteopathic physicians serve their country as 23 members of the United States armed forces; they also practice in 24 rural and medically underserved areas of the state, and in some

1 instances they are the only doctors in their respective counties; a 2 number of these dedicated professionals are providing medical care 3 to Texas legislators and their staffs as participants in the Doctor 4 of the Day program at the State Capitol during the week of February 5 21 to February 25, 2011; and

6 WHEREAS, Practitioners of osteopathic medicine play a vital 7 role in maintaining the health and well-being of countless Texans, 8 and they may indeed reflect with pride on their myriad 9 contributions to this state; now, therefore, be it
