1 WHEREAS, The football team of Byron P. Steele II High School
2 in Cibolo won the University Interscholastic League 5A Division II
3 state championship on December 18, 2010, with a hard-fought 24-21
4 victory over Guyer High School of Denton; and

5 WHEREAS, The Knights held a talented Guyer team to its
6 second-lowest point total of the season to claim the title in front
7 of nearly 38,000 fans at Cowboys Stadium in Arlington; Steele High
8 running back Malcolm Brown scored his third touchdown with just
9 2:33 left in the game to overcome a 21-17 deficit; he also rushed
10 for 112 yards and was named offensive most valuable player of the
11 game; Kwame Clark sealed the victory with an interception that
12 ended Guyer's final drive; and

13 WHEREAS, Under the guidance of head coach Michael Jinks and
14 his staff, the Knights won their last 13 games of the season to
15 finish with a 14-2 record; as a result of its exceptional play, the
16 team achieved national prominence with a rating of number 49 in the
17 country in the final Powerade Fab 50 rankings from ESPN Rise; and

18 WHEREAS, Winning a state championship is the culmination of
19 countless hours of hard work and an unwavering commitment to
20 excellence, and these dedicated student-athletes may take
21 justifiable pride in their outstanding accomplishment; now,
