- WHEREAS, The citizens of Houston lost a spirited and influential leader with the death of Nancy Gene Dale Palm on February 15, 2011, at the age of 89; and
 WHEREAS, Born on April 14, 1921, in Davidson County,
 Tennessee, to Mary and Dillard Dale, Nancy Gene Dale was a descendant of the five pioneer families who settled central Tennessee and established Fort Nashborough; after losing her father
- 8 at an early age, she moved with her mother and five sisters to 9 Nashville and graduated from Vanderbilt University in 1942; and
- 10 WHEREAS, That same year, she married Dr. William Morrison
- 11 Palm on July 4, and the couple relocated to Houston in 1951; Mrs.
- 12 Palm soon thereafter became active in the local Republican Party
- 13 and was elected in 1967 as Harris County party chair, a position she
- 14 held for seven years; in addition, she played an instrumental role
- 15 in the development of the party at the statewide level; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Known for her passionate support of conservative
- 17 ideals and her effective organizational abilities, she championed
- 18 the principles of self-determination and achievement through
- 19 education and hard work; a redhead who frequently wore red, white,
- 20 and blue, she was affectionately dubbed "Napalm" by the press for
- 21 her forcefulness and the strong opinions that she readily shared;
- 22 this Texas trailblazer helped open doors for women in politics, and
- 23 she encouraged future senator Kay Bailey Hutchison to run for the
- 24 Texas Legislature in 1972; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Mrs. Palm was a delegate at the Republican National
- 2 Convention in 1976 and received a vote to be the party's nominee for
- 3 vice president; she had the opportunity to vote for President
- 4 George H. W. Bush in 1988 and his son in 2004 as a member of the
- 5 Texas electoral college delegation; and
- 6 WHEREAS, This esteemed Texan inspired many with her dynamic
- 7 leadership in the party whose values she fully embraced, and she
- 8 will long be remembered with deep admiration for her contributions
- 9 to her country and her community; now, therefore, be it
- 10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 82nd Texas
- 11 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the memory of Nancy Gene Dale Palm
- 12 and extend sincere sympathy to the members of her family: to her
- 13 sister, Katherine Bishop Dale Potts, and her husband, J. Ivan
- 14 Potts; to her nephew, Tom DeLong; and to her other relatives and
