WHEREAS, Highly regarded for her expertise on senior citizens' issues, Ms. Pennington was appointed to represent her congressional district at the White House Conference on Aging in

1 1995; she has served her community in a wide variety of ways through the years, including volunteering for the Austin Independent School 2 3 District, serving as president of Gullett Elementary School's PTA, and serving on the City Council of PTAs; moreover, she participated 4 5 in political campaigns for John Trevino, Richard Moya, and Gonzalo Barrientos; among other accolades, she has received the Excellence 6 in Writing Award from the Texas Association of Bilingual Education; 7 8 she serves today on the Austin Arts Commission and several other 9 community boards and commissions; and

10 WHEREAS, Gloria Mata Pennington has made a positive 11 difference in her community, and her outstanding accomplishments 12 are a source of pride and inspiration to many people; now, 13 therefore, be it
