WHEREAS, Eustasio A. Cepeda was posthumously recognized by
the Austin History Center in conjunction with its exhibit Mexican
American Firsts: Trailblazers of Austin and Travis County; and

WHEREAS, Honoring the important contributions made 4 by 5 Mexican Americans to Central Texas, the Austin History Center and its association joined with the Austin Public Library to organize 6 7 the show, which ran from August 21, 2010, through January 16, 2011; Mexican American Firsts: Trailblazers of Austin and Travis County 8 9 celebrated the pioneering achievements of 32 remarkable men and women and provided the public with an opportunity to learn more 10 11 about their lives; and

WHEREAS, One such individual, Eustasio Cepeda, was honored for his achievements in public service; after immigrating to Austin to escape the Mexican Revolution, he and others began advocating for the establishment of a Mexican consulate office in the Capitol City, and succeeded in their goal three years later; and

WHEREAS, Deemed by some the unofficial first Mexican consul 17 in Austin because of his efforts, Mr. Cepeda was an active member of 18 numerous civic and patriotic organizations, and many of the state's 19 elected leaders, including Governors Miriam "Ma" Ferguson, James 20 Allred, Wilbert Lee "Pappy" O'Daniel, Coke Stevenson, Beauford 21 Jester, and Allan Shivers, looked to him for advice and 22 23 information; he passed away in 1972, and in 1998 the City of Austin dedicated the Eustasio Cepeda Branch Library in his memory; and 24
