1 WHEREAS, The Plano Senior High School debate team has
2 advanced to the Elite 8 of the 2010-2011 International Public
3 Policy Forum, a competition that includes many of the best high
4 school teams in the world; and

5 WHEREAS, More than 340 schools entered the 2010-2011
6 tournament, which is sponsored by New York University and the law
7 firm of Bickel & Brewer and is billed as the only international
8 contest where high school students argue public policy in written
9 and oral forms; and

10 WHEREAS, For the first leg of the competition, teams
11 submitted an essay taking a position on the justification of the
12 NATO intervention in Afghanistan; Plano excelled at this test and
13 was one of the 32 schools to survive to the next round; competing
14 against their opponents via e-mail, the Wildcats have continued
15 their run and are one of eight remaining contenders who will take
16 part in the oral-debate phase of the tournament; and

17 WHEREAS, That matchup will take place in New York City in
18 April, where the students will vie for the title of world champion
19 and a grand prize of \$10,000; and

20 WHEREAS, The Plano Senior High School debate team has tested
21 its mettle against top-notch rivals from around the world and
22 proven itself a force with which to be reckoned, and these talented
23 and dedicated students may take justifiable pride in becoming one
24 of the Forum's Elite 8 teams; now, therefore, be it
