5 WHEREAS, A graduate of the business and law schools at the University of Missouri at Columbia, Ray Klinginsmith is an attorney 6 7 who served as general counsel and a professor of business administration at Truman State University for more than two 8 decades; during this time, he further distinguished himself as dean 9 of administration for the university in a period of transition, and 10 11 he later served a four-year term as an Adair County commissioner; 12 and

13 WHEREAS, This enterprising citizen has been a member of the 14 Rotary Club of Kirksville since 1961, and over the course of the past half-century he has contributed greatly to the organization; 15 he has served as district governor and as chair of the Council on 16 Legislation and the Los Angeles Convention Committee and was a 17 member of the board of directors and chair of its executive 18 committee; in addition, he joined the board of trustees of the 19 20 Rotary Foundation in 2002 and has served as its vice chair and as a 21 member of its Future Vision Committee; moreover, he has been 22 recognized as a major donor and was named a recipient of the Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service and Distinguished 23 24 Service Award; and

1 WHEREAS, Mr. Klinginsmith took office as president of Rotary International in July 2010, heading a global network of 1.2 million 2 3 business and professional leaders who seek to improve their communities through their volunteer service; during his term, he is 4 encouraging Rotary's 33,000 clubs to partner with local government 5 and other organizations to increase literacy, provide sustainable 6 sources of food and clean water in developing countries, and 7 8 eradicate polio; Rotary International also sponsors the largest privately funded international scholarship program in the world, 9 10 and its recipients include Mr. Klinginsmith himself, who studied at the University of Cape Town in South Africa in 1961 as a Rotary 11 12 Foundation ambassadorial scholar; and

WHEREAS, A director of Macon-Atlanta State Bank in Macon, 13 14 Missouri, since 1971, Mr. Klinginsmith has shared his time and 15 talents with numerous community groups; he was the president of the Chariton Valley Association from its inception in 1982 until 2009, 16 17 and he was one of the initial trustees for the Missouri Family Trust, which benefits people with disabilities; a former member of 18 19 the executive board for the Great Rivers Council of the Boy Scouts of America, he received the Silver Beaver Award for his years of 20 volunteerism; he also was recognized with a Parent/Caretaker Award 21 from the Missouri Planning Council for Developmental Disabilities 22 23 in 1988; and

24 WHEREAS, A devoted family man, Mr. Klinginsmith enjoys the 25 love and support of his wife, Judie, a retired elementary school 26 teacher and educational consultant, and he treasures his two 27 children, Leigh and Kurt, and three grandchildren, Morgan, Grant,

1 and Sydney Perkins; he is also a member of and former lay speaker at 2 the First United Methodist Church in Kirksville; and
