1 WHEREAS, Family and friends are mourning the loss of Fort 2 Worth businessman and civic leader David M. Beckerman, who passed 3 away on February 20, 2011, at the age of 83; and

WHEREAS, Born to Oscar and Emma Beckerman in New York City, 4 5 Mr. Beckerman forged a long and highly successful career in marketing and electronics; he worked with the Tandy/RadioShack 6 corporation for more than 41 years and served in a number of 7 important leadership roles, including those of senior vice 8 president of marketing services and vice president of operations; 9 he was known as "Mr. Direct Mail" for leading the company's 10 11 successful direct mail advertising campaign, and he shared his 12 knowledge and expertise as a special volunteer advisor to the U.S. 13 postmaster general; and

14 WHEREAS, Mr. Beckerman helped promote cultural understanding and tolerance as a member of the board of the National Council of 15 Christians and Jews and as a trustee and member of the executive 16 committee of the NCCJ Fort Worth chapter, now known as the 17 Multicultural Alliance; his outstanding civic contributions also 18 included service on the executive committees of the Fort Worth 19 Dallas Ballet and Casa Manana Theatre, and he was the founding 20 21 president of the Texas Assembly of Arts Councils; and

WHEREAS, Devoted to his faith, Mr. Beckerman was a director of Congregation Ahavath Sholom and the L. F. Shanblum Lodge of B'nai B'rith; moreover, he gave generously of his time and talents

1 to the Jewish Federation of Fort Worth and Tarrant County, serving
2 as president, campaign chair, and director; and

3 WHEREAS, Mr. Beckerman and his wife, Greta, enjoyed a deeply rewarding marriage of more than 60 years; they were wed on June 3, 4 5 1950, and were blessed with three children, Iris, Heidi, and Neil, as well as five grandchildren; the couple received the B'nai B'rith 6 International Distinguished Achievement Award for their myriad 7 8 philanthropic endeavors, and Mr. Beckerman also received a 2001 Citation Award from the National Conference for Community and 9 10 Justice; and

11 WHEREAS, David Beckerman lived a full and generous life, and 12 he will forever be remembered with admiration and affection by all 13 who held him close to their hearts; now, therefore, be it

14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 82nd Texas 15 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the memory of David M.
