RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Family and friends were deeply saddened by the loss 2 of Houston businessman and community leader Gilbert Manly Turner, who passed away on February 14, 2011, at the age of 88; and 3 WHEREAS, Born on March 18, 1922, in the Travis Peak community 4 5 of Travis County to George Manly and Anna Marie Gerstman Turner, Gilbert Turner grew up in Milam County and then enrolled at Texas 6 7 A&M University in 1941, holding three part-time jobs while maintaining a perfect grade point average; he left in 1943 for 8 officer's training school, and served in the United States Army 9 from 1944 to 1946, returning afterwards to graduate at the top of 10 11 his class; he was a member of the national championship pistol team, 12 the rifle team, and the Distinguished Students Council, and he was president of the Accounting Society; and 13 14 WHEREAS, While working as a CPA in 1948, Mr. Turner helped to begin a company that eventually became BorTunCo, the largest boring 15 and tunneling company in the country, and his patented inventions 16 and innovations in machinery and methods revolutionized the 17 industry; he also contributed to the invention of a drilling 18 machine approved by the Alaska Pipeline authorities and used all 19 20 over the world; and 21 WHEREAS, Mr. Turner was additionally one of the founders, and later the chair of the board and CEO, of the American Steel Building 22

Company, which specialized in pre-engineered buildings such as

airplane hangars, sports arenas, and industrial and commercial

2 WHEREAS, During the Reagan administration, Mr. Turner was 3 appointed by the secretary of defense to serve as chair of the National Committee of Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve; he 4 5 was a member of the board of trustees of Houston Baptist University, and chaired that body for 19 years, additionally serving as chair of 6 the president's council and the development council; the recipient 7 8 of an honorary doctorate from the university, he established and funded a number of endowed scholarships for students; and 9 10 WHEREAS, Mr. Turner also created scholarships in perpetuity at his alma mater, Texas A&M, and served on the Chancellor's Century 11 Council; he was a member of the Houston Aggie Club and the Diamond 12 Century Club, sponsored Texas A&M basketball and football 13 14 programming, and was named a distinguished alumnus in 1984; and WHEREAS, This industrious Texan shared his time and talents 15 with the Houston Chamber of Commerce and Rotary International, and 16 17 he was appointed by Governor Bill Clements to the San Jacinto Water Authority board; a man of strong faith, he was an active member of 18 19 the Second Baptist Church, and he further distinguished himself as the chair of the Billy Graham Crusade for Houston and the Gulf Coast 20 21 in 1981; moreover, he served with Youth for Christ for 30 years; and WHEREAS, Known for his honesty and trustworthiness, he 22 delighted in travelling, ranching, and taking on challenges, and 23 24 above all, his family; he shared 64 years of marriage with his wife, Claydene, before her passing, and he welcomed three children, five 25 26 grandchildren, and seven great-grandchildren into his family; and

WHEREAS, While the death of Gilbert Turner has brought much
