1 WHEREAS, The Texas A&M University College of Agriculture and  
2 Life Sciences is celebrating the 100th anniversary of its  
3 establishment in 2011; and

4 WHEREAS, Officially organized as the School of Agriculture in  
5 1911, the college has grown from an initial enrollment of 166 to  
6 serve some 6,500 students today; offering 40 undergraduate degree  
7 programs and over 50 graduate programs in 14 departments, the  
8 college graduates more students in agriculturally related fields  
9 than anywhere else in the country; in addition, it partners with the  
10 four Texas A&M AgriLife agencies to fulfill the university's  
11 land-grant mission of teaching, research, extension, and service;

13 WHEREAS, Students in the College of Agriculture and Life  
14 Sciences benefit from instruction by a world-class faculty that  
15 includes a Nobel Prize laureate and a Pulitzer Prize winner; the  
16 college is widely recognized as a leader in a number of academic  
17 disciplines, and its programs range from long-established majors  
18 such as agronomy and animal science to newer fields of study such as  
19 forensics and spatial sciences; moreover, in their research,  
20 faculty members address many vital issues, including fuels for the  
21 future, potential cures for diseases, and the safety and abundance  
22 of the food supply; graduates of the school have gone on to  
23 distinguish themselves as leaders in science, industry, business,  
24 and government at the local, state, and national levels; and
