- 1 WHEREAS, Texas aviation pioneer and entrepreneur Henry
- 2 Leland Snow of Wichita Falls passed away on February 20, 2011, at
- 3 the age of 80; and
- WHEREAS, Leland Snow was born in Brownsville on May 31, 1930,
- 5 to Henry Evans Snow and Carrie Beth Sewell Snow; raised in the Rio
- 6 Grande Valley, he earned a degree in aeronautical engineering at
- 7 Texas A&M University in 1952; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Widely regarded as the creator of the modern
- 9 crop-dusting airplane, Mr. Snow designed and constructed his first
- 10 agricultural aircraft, the S-1, in 1951; he flew the plane himself
- 11 on crop-dusting jobs in Texas and Nicaragua before founding Snow
- 12 Aeronautical in 1955; a few years later, he opened a factory in
- 13 Olney, where he manufactured the next generation of crop dusters,
- 14 the S-2A and S-2B; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Snow sold his company to Rockwell-Standard in
- 16 1965, but stayed on as vice president of the Aero Commander division
- 17 and helped to design the Thrush aircraft; he left Rockwell in 1972
- 18 to start Air Tractor, eventually opening a new factory in Olney;
- 19 today, Air Tractors are used the world over for crop dusting,
- 20 firefighting, cleaning up oil spills, and more; president of the
- 21 company until his death, Mr. Snow also remained active in
- 22 engineering; and
- WHEREAS, This esteemed businessman received many awards and
- 24 recognitions over the course of his illustrious career; he was

- 1 inducted into the Texas Aviation Hall of Fame in 2000, and in 2005,
- 2 Air Tractor earned the International Torch Award for Marketplace
- 3 Ethics from the Better Business Bureau; he contributed generously
- 4 to the National Agricultural Aviation Association, in particular to
- 5 its pilot safety and drift minimization programs; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Among Mr. Snow's many interests were classical
- 7 music, playing the piano, and running; he supported the Wichita
- 8 Falls Symphony Orchestra, as well as local arts, and he
- 9 participated in three marathons, including the famous New York City
- 10 Marathon, after the age of 65; and
- 11 WHEREAS, In all of his endeavors, Mr. Snow enjoyed the love
- 12 and support of his wife, the former Nancy Bacon, whom he married in
- 13 1946; together they were blessed with two daughters, Kara and
- 14 Kristin, as well as two grandchildren, Brennan and Elisabeth; and
- WHEREAS, Leland Snow will long be remembered, not only for
- 16 his remarkable innovations in aviation and his contributions to his
- 17 community, but also for the kindness, determination, and charity
- 18 with which he lived his life; now, therefore, be it
- 19 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 82nd Texas
- 20 Legislature hereby pay tribute to the memory of Henry Leland Snow
- 21 and extend sincere condolences to the members of his family: to his
