17 Brazosport Planetarium and a member of the executive committee of

18 the Brazosport Area Chamber of Commerce; and

19 WHEREAS, Mr. Wille further shared his time and talents as an

20 elected member of the Brazosport College board of regents for more

21 than a decade, and he supported the college through contributions

22 to its scholarship programs, fund-raising campaigns, and music

23 performance center; with his wife, he volunteered with the

24 Southwest SIDS Research Institute, and he gathered donations for

- 4 Mr. Wille served as treasurer of the First United Methodist Church
- 5 in Lake Jackson; he was known for his quiet and unassuming manner,
- 6 his willingness to donate extraordinary time and effort, and his
- 7 steadfast belief in serving his fellow man; and
