Texas Hill Country, Burnet County was organized by the 4th Texas

6 Legislature in 1852 and named for David G. Burnet, president of the

7 provisional government of the Republic of Texas; the county seat

8 was established in the town of Hamilton, which changed its name to

9 Burnet in 1858; and

10 WHEREAS, The county's economy was originally dependent on

agriculture, but the harnessing of the Colorado River by the Lower

12 Colorado River Authority beginning in the 1930s and the creation of

13 the Highland Lakes helped turn Burnet County into a popular

recreational and vacation destination, and residents and visitors

15 from all across Texas enjoy swimming, boating, fishing, and camping

16 on Inks Lake and Lakes Buchanan, Lyndon B. Johnson, and Travis; and

17 WHEREAS, Wilderness lovers, bird-watchers, and amateur

astronomers are drawn by the Canyon of the Eagles Nature Park and

19 Resort; the Hill Country Flyer train ride and the Vanishing Texas

20 River Cruise offer tours of the county's scenic wonders, and

21 visitors to Longhorn Cavern State Park delight in the grottoes and

22 rich history of this unique attraction; and

23 WHEREAS, The vast dome of Granite Mountain supplied the stone

24 used in the construction of the State Capitol and a number of state
