- 1 WHEREAS, Edward and Alda Nahas of Plano, Texas, are 2 celebrating a notable milestone on April 30, 2011, as that date 3 marks the 40th anniversary of Mr. Nahas's arrival in the United

- 5 WHEREAS, The son of Lebanese citizens Gabriel and Mary Nahas,
- 6 Edward Gabriel Nahas was living with his family in Libya, where his
- 7 father held a sensitive communications position, when on September
- 8 1, 1969, a military coup overthrew the government; both foreigners
- 9 and Christians, Edward Nahas, his parents, and his brothers, Tony
- 10 and Maurice, were expelled from Libya with just 24 hours' notice and
- 11 forced to leave behind their friends, home, and livelihoods; after
- 12 several months of uncertainty, the family received the support of
- 13 the American Embassy and secured their new home in the United
- 14 States; and
- WHEREAS, Alda Butros, the daughter of John and Mary Butros of
- 16 Beirut, Lebanon, came to the United States in 1975 to marry Edward
- 17 Nahas; shortly thereafter, her parents and her siblings, Rima and
- 18 Laurine Butros, lost their home in the turbulence of the Lebanese
- 19 civil war and joined her in America; and
- WHEREAS, Settling in Pasadena, California, the Nahas family
- 21 opened their own service stations, and Edward Nahas registered for
- 22 the Selective Service, enrolled in the local community college, and
- 23 took a second job working nights as a crane operator; he then
- 24 advanced to a sales position in a Los Angeles-based steel company

- 1 while Mrs. Nahas worked as a coordinator for Walt Disney Studios
- 2 post-production services; Mr. Nahas became a U.S. citizen in 1977
- 3 and Mrs. Nahas followed suit in 1984; and
- WHEREAS, The couple moved to Texas in 1985, and Mrs. Nahas
- 5 focused on raising their two treasured children, Cynthia Marie and
- 6 John Mark, as her husband accepted an offer at a home-building
- 7 company and later founded his own construction enterprise, American
- 8 Homes; he went on to open a granite import and fabrication business
- 9 in 2001, and Mrs. Nahas went to work for a hotel management and
- 10 purchasing company, advancing to become a senior project manager;
- 11 Mr. and Mrs. Nahas were active during this time in their children's
- 12 school, church, and extracurricular endeavors, including youth
- 13 soccer, and they also helped create a crime watch program in their
- 14 neighborhood; in addition, Mr. Nahas volunteered to assist local
- 15 law enforcement in antiterrorism investigations; and
- 16 WHEREAS, This inspiring pair experienced the joy of seeing
- 17 their children graduate from The University of Texas at Austin;
- 18 continuing her education, their daughter, Cynthia, earned a degree
- 19 from the UT School of Law, while their son, John Mark, earned a
- 20 master's degree in real estate development from the University of
- 21 Southern California; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Edward and Alda Nahas appreciated the value of their
- 23 newfound life and liberty and capitalized on every opportunity to
- 24 attain success and happiness for their family, and their hard work
- 25 and perseverance in pursuit of these goals are truly worthy of
