2 passing of James Rutledge Mason of Waxahachie on March 31, 2011, at

3 the age of 96; and

WHEREAS, Born in Biardstown in Lamar County on July 13, 1914,

5 Mr. Mason was the son of Luther Emerson Mason and Lila Mae Mason; he

6 graduated from Paris High School in 1931 and attended Paris Junior

7 College before completing his bachelor's degree in business

8 administration at The University of Texas at Austin; on June 1,

9 1940, he married the former Dora Frances Whitehead, and they later

10 became the parents of two children, James and Lila Jean; Mr. and

11 Mrs. Mason shared a fulfilling relationship of more than 60 years

12 before her passing in 2001; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Mason served his country in the United States

14 Army during World War II; a sergeant (E-5), he was stationed in the

15 Pacific theater and landed on Okinawa on April 3, 1945; he served

16 there until the end of the war and received numerous commendations,

17 among them the Rifle and Carbine Expert Medal, the World War II

18 Victory Medal, and the Asiatic-Pacific Campaign Medal with two

19 battle stars for the Philippines and Okinawa campaigns; and

20 WHEREAS, A distinguished member of the banking industry for

21 four decades, Mr. Mason began his career as a teller at Paris

22 National Bank in 1936; he was later employed by Liberty State Bank

23 and National City Bank in Dallas; after earning his graduate

- 4 vice president of Republic National Bank of Dallas; and
- 5 WHEREAS, This civic-minded Texan was deeply committed to his
- 6 community; in addition to volunteering for Meals on Wheels, the
- 7 Baylor Hospital of Waxahachie Auxiliary, and Pleasant Manor Living
- 8 Center, he supported such charities as the Salvation Army, the USO,
- 9 and Mothers Against Drunk Driving, and he and his wife worked
- 10 together with great energy and dedication in behalf of political
- 11 campaigns; moreover, Mr. Mason was a valued member of Central
- 12 Presbyterian Church and served his faith as a Sunday school
- 13 teacher, member of the session, and treasurer; he was also a life
- 14 member of the American Legion and Veterans of Foreign Wars; his
- 15 hobbies included fishing and hunting, and he was a charter fan of
- 16 the Texas Rangers; and
- 17 WHEREAS, James Mason made a positive difference in the lives
- 18 of others, and those who were privileged to share in his love and
- 19 friendship will forever treasure their memories of his kindness,
