

R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, The 1936 Texas Centennial Exposition's "Home for the
2 Future" in Dallas is celebrating the 75th anniversary of its
3 construction in 2011; and

4 WHEREAS, Located in the North Oak Cliff neighborhood, the
5 "Home for the Future" was built for the 100th anniversary of the
6 founding of the Republic of Texas in 1836; costing \$15,000, the
7 house was billed as the first all-electric home in North America and
8 boasted a view of the burgeoning downtown Dallas skyline from a
9 second floor deck; and

10 WHEREAS, The "Home for the Future" was architecturally
11 designed in the manner of such notable Bauhaus and Art Deco Texas
12 Centennial Exposition buildings as the Magnolia Lounge and what is
13 now the Women's Museum, and General Electric outfitted its rooms
14 with many state-of-the-art appliances that it wished to introduce
15 to prospective home buyers; and

16 WHEREAS, In 1994, Cameron Smith purchased the property and
17 has worked to restore many of its original architectural details;
18 today a North Oak Cliff landmark, it has been featured in fashion
19 shoots, films, and commercial productions; and

20 WHEREAS, The "Home for the Future" is an important piece of
21 the history of Dallas and a striking example of Art Deco design, and
22 it is indeed a pleasure to recognize the house during this milestone
23 year; now, therefore, be it
