## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, A full and generous life drew to a close with the 2 death of Isaac Field Roebuck, Jr., of Dallas on April 15, 2011, at 3 the age of 80; and

WHEREAS, Born in Graham on September 6, 1930, Field Roebuck 4 5 earned his diploma from Graham High School in 1948; he attended The University of Texas at Austin, where he graduated summa cum laude, 6 7 receiving both his bachelor's and master's degrees in petroleum engineering; possessing a gift for music, he was a drum major in his 8 high school band and a member of the Longhorn Band at UT, serving as 9 its president in 1951 and 1952; he also helped pay his way through 10 college by playing tenor saxophone and clarinet for dance bands in 11 12 the Austin area; and

13 WHEREAS, In 1957, Mr. Roebuck married the former Joan 14 Gerhardt, and they enjoyed a rewarding relationship that spanned 15 more than 50 years and were blessed with a daughter, Sue Ellen; and

16 WHEREAS, After his graduation from UT, Mr. Roebuck joined the 17 petroleum engineering faculty at the school and also became a 18 registered professional engineer; he later served as the vice 19 president of overseas exploration for Core Laboratories and vice 20 president and general manager of Engineering Numerics Corporation; 21 in addition, he was president of his own independent engineering 22 and geological consulting company, Roebuck Associates; and

23 WHEREAS, Listed in Who's Who in the Southwest, Who's Who in 24 Science and Engineering, and American Men and Women of Science, Mr.

1 Roebuck was a member of the Society of Independent Professional 2 Earth Scientists, the Society of Petroleum Engineers, and the 3 American Association of Petroleum Geologists; he shared his 4 professional expertise as an adjunct professor of geological 5 sciences at Southern Methodist University and authored 35 6 scientific papers; and

7 WHEREAS, Mr. Roebuck was a dedicated organic gardener and 8 rosarian; as a freelance writer and photographer, he contributed 9 gardening articles to the *Dallas Morning News* and other 10 publications and authored the books *Foolproof Guide to Growing* 11 *Roses* and *Complete Roses: Featuring 100 Easy-Growing Favorites*; he 12 was a member of the Garden Writers Association and the Western 13 Writers of America; and

WHEREAS, A past president of the First Men's Garden Club of Dallas, Mr. Roebuck also belonged to the Dallas Area Historical Rose Society, and a rose called the Field Roebuck was released to honor his service to those two groups; in addition, he was a member of the Heritage Rose Society, the Heritage Rose Foundation, the Texas Botanical Garden Society, the Royal Horticultural Society, and the Seeds of Texas Seed Exchange; and

21 WHEREAS, Field Roebuck was an admired individual who excelled 22 in a wide variety of pursuits, and he will be fondly remembered and 23 deeply missed by all who were privileged to know him; now, 24 therefore, be it
