1 WHEREAS, The Salt Lick was the featured restaurant on April
2 12, 2011, for "Bar-B-Quesday," and it is one of the outstanding
3 Central Texas businesses that have generously supported the popular
4 hall lunch event during the 82nd Legislative Session; and

5 WHEREAS, Hosted by State Representative Jason Isaac,
6 Bar-B-Quesday has served up tasty fare for an appreciative crowd at
7 the State Capitol on Tuesdays, and this highly anticipated
8 get-together has provided a showcase for some of the legendary
9 establishments in House District 45 specializing in that beloved
10 cuisine; and

11 WHEREAS, The Salt Lick was founded in Driftwood in 1967 by
12 Thurman Roberts and his family, and it traces its recipe for searing
13 and slow-cooking meat to Bettie Howard, the grandmother of Mr.
14 Roberts, who arrived in Texas in the 1860s; today, the Salt Lick is
15 owned by Thurman's son Scott and hosts thousands of diners each week
16 at its original restaurant as well as operating locations in Round
17 Rock and at the airports in Austin and Oklahoma City; and

18 WHEREAS, While many distinctive foods are associated with the
19 Lone Star State, barbecue holds a special place in our culinary
20 heritage, and the Salt Lick is indeed deserving of recognition for
21 helping to focus attention on the prominent role that Central Texas
22 has played in building and maintaining that proud tradition; now,
