1 WHEREAS, Collin County lost an admired civic leader with the 2 passing of Joseph Allen Hill on January 15, 2011, at the age of 84; 3 and

4 WHEREAS, Born in Gordonsville, Virginia, on March 18, 1926, 5 Joe Hill was the son of Picollia Dade Hill and Robert A. Hill; he graduated from Orange County High School and served his country in 6 7 the Navy Reserve for two years; after earning his bachelor's degree in chemistry from Clark University, he worked as a chemist for 8 9 General Electric in Schenectady, New York, for 13 years and won numerous awards for product and company improvements; he went on to 10 11 join the Xerox Corporation in Rochester, New York, before 12 transferring to the Dallas area; over the course of a distinguished tenure spanning three decades with the company, he also worked in 13 14 California for a year; and

WHEREAS, Deeply committed to his community, Mr. Hill gave 15 generously of his time and talents to benefit the elderly; he 16 organized and led the Senior Coalition, which was instrumental in 17 18 the construction of the Plano Senior Center, conducting petition drives and advocating for the center at innumerable meetings; he 19 served as president of the advisory council for the center and as 20 21 co-chair of its capital improvements program, and he frequently gave seniors rides to the center, drove them to appointments, and 22 23 helped them in myriad ways; in addition, he took photos of almost every event at the center and assisted with daily bread donations; 24

he further served on the boards of the Collin County Committee on
 Aging, the Plano Community Home, and the Maurice Barnett Geriatric
 Wellness Center, and he organized the Collin County White House
 Conference on Aging; and

5 WHEREAS, This dynamic Texan was a member of Volunteers in Plano, the Martin Luther King Community Center, and the Dallas 6 Independent School District's Safety and Excel programs; moreover, 7 8 he was a member of the Collin County Black Chamber of Commerce and the Plano Chamber of Commerce and served as a consultant for both; 9 10 the recipient of numerous accolades, he was named Plano Man of the Year and Plano Volunteer of the Year, and he was accorded the Andre 11 12 Davidson Spirit of Volunteerism Award, the Plano Senior Coalition Award, and the Plano Community Forum Award, among other honors; and 13 14 WHEREAS, A man of many interests, Mr. Hill enjoyed

15 photography, track, and baseball, and he was a member of the semipro
16 baseball team the Troy Haymakers; and

WHEREAS, Joe Hill made a positive difference in countless lives through his tremendous kindness, and his contributions to his community will continue to resonate in the years to come; now, therefore, be it
