## RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, Texas provides vital health care services to its
- 2 residents through more than 590 hospitals, which together house
- 3 some 82,000 licensed beds; and
- 4 WHEREAS, These diverse institutions range from general
- 5 acute-care and pediatric hospitals to psychiatric, rehabilitation,
- 6 long-term acute-care, and other specialty facilities; about 27
- 7 percent are located in rural areas of the state, while more than 73
- 8 percent are in urban areas; and
- 9 WHEREAS, During 2009, Texas hospitals provided care for an
- 10 estimated 2.7 million inpatients, 37 million outpatients, and 9.5
- 11 million emergency patients, and they were the site of 808,000
- 12 inpatient surgeries and 395,000 births; and
- WHEREAS, Over 260 of the state's hospitals are designated
- 14 trauma facilities and staffed by specially trained physicians and
- 15 nurses, as well as supported by EMS personnel who provide urgent
- 16 prehospital care through ground and air transportation; this trauma
- 17 system is critical to the health and economic well-being of Texas;
- 18 and
- 19 WHEREAS, Hospitals rank as the number two source of private
- 20 sector jobs in rural areas of the state and are among the top 20
- 21 employers in major metropolitan areas, with approximately 366,000
- 22 full-time and part-time employees statewide, including some
- 23 120,000 registered nurses and licensed vocational nurses; and
- WHEREAS, Jobs in Texas hospitals generate approximately \$137

- 1 billion in economic activity annually, and one in nine U.S. jobs are
- 2 supported either directly or indirectly by hospitals; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Texas has the highest rate of uninsured residents in
- 4 the nation, and hospitals are required by state and federal law to
- 5 assess and stabilize all who come to the emergency room, without
- 6 regard to their ability to pay; and
- WHEREAS, Hospitals stand ready to serve 24 hours a day, 7 days
- 8 a week, 365 days a year, and it is indeed fitting to acknowledge the
- 9 contributions of these vital institutions; now, therefore, be it
- 10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 82nd Texas
- 11 Legislature hereby join in observing May 8-14, 2011, as National
- 12 Hospital Week and in recognizing all those who serve in hospitals
- 13 across the Lone Star State.
